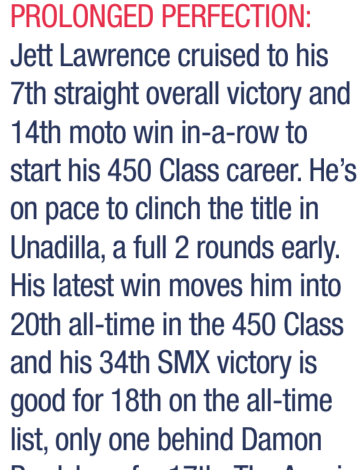

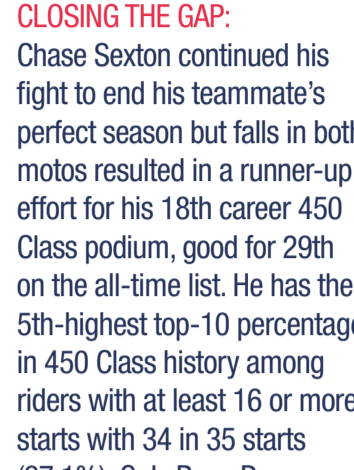


450 STORYLINES

SPRING CREEK RECAP



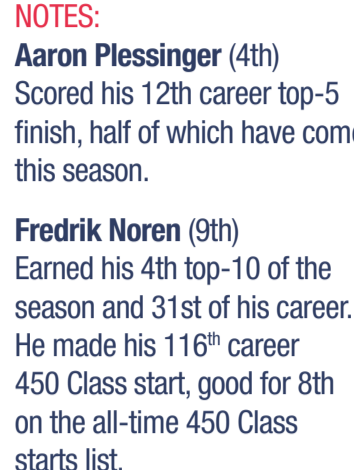
**PROLONGED PERFECTION:** Jett Lawrence cruised to his 7th straight overall victory and 14th moto win in-a-row to start his 450 Class career. He's on pace to clinch the title in Unadilla, a full 2 rounds early. His latest win moves him into 20th all-time in the 450 Class and his 34th SMX victory is good for 18th on the all-time list, only one behind Damon Bradshaw for 17th. The Aussie also passed Ken Roczen, Gary Jones, and Chase Sexton for 7th on Honda's all-time 450 Class wins list. He is 1 behind Bob Hannah and Kevin Windham, who are tied for 5th.



**CLOSING THE GAP:** Chase Sexton continued his fight to end his teammate's perfect season but falls in both motos resulted in a runner-up effort for his 18th career 450 Class podium, good for 29th on the all-time list. He has the 5th-highest top-10 percentage in 450 Class history among riders with at least 16 or more starts with 34 in 35 starts (97.1%). Only Ryan Dungey (98.9%), Eli Tomac (97.8%), Ricky Carmichael (97.7%), and Mike Kiedrowski (97.4%) have a higher percentage in 450 Class history.



**FERRANDIS FLYING:** Since his comeback from an injury in Supercross Dylan Ferrandis has returned to form in Pro Motocross scoring 11 podiums in 14 motos and 5 overall podiums in 7 rounds. He comfortably sits 2nd in the 450 Class standings and is poised to move into 6th in the SMX standings by Unadilla. The Frenchman has an incredible 17 podiums, 19 top-5s, and 20 top-10 finishes in only 21 450 Class starts.



**NOTES:**  
**Aaron Plessinger (4th)** Scored his 12th career top-5 finish, half of which have come this season.  
**Fredrik Noren (9th)** Earned his 4th top-10 of the season and 31st of his career. He made his 116th career 450 Class start, good for 8th on the all-time 450 Class starts list.  
**Preston Taylor (33rd), Crockett Myers (35th), & Travis Prier (41st)** all made their first 450 Class starts.

WASHOUGAL FACTS

**HISTORY LESSON:** The first 450 Class (then 250cc) race at Washougal MX Park was on August 14, 1983, when Rick Johnson won on a Yamaha. Bob Hannah won the first moto but a broken chain plagued his second moto. David Bailey went 4-3 and ended up winning the title that season. That event was the 25th race of the 1983 Grand National Championship while this year's race is coincidentally the 25th race of the SuperMotocross World Championship.

**32 SEASONS OF HISTORY:** Washougal MX Park had previously hosted both 125cc and 500cc races before the 250cc division made its first appearance in 1983. The 250cc class continued through 1985 but then did not return to Washougal until 1994, the year following the demise of the 500cc class. This year will signify the 33rd appearance for the 450 Class at Washougal.

**WINDHAM & WASHOUGAL:** Ricky Carmichael won 76 of the 88 total 450 Class races he entered. From 2000 to his retirement halfway through the 2007 season Carmichael only missed one 450 Class race (Steel City 2001 when he decided to race the finale in the 125cc Class). During his 7 1/2 season reign as the G.O.A.T., just 4 riders managed to beat him at least 4 times. Tim Ferry and David Vuillemin outlasted Carmichael 4 times, while Sebastian Tortelli beat out Carmichael 5 times. While Windham owns the record with 8 defeats of Carmichael. Kevin Windham RC did not win during his reign, only 5 were won via 1-1 moto sweeps. Sebastian Tortelli, Kevin Windham, and James Stewart make up the entire list of riders who swept a 450 Class race during Carmichael's tenure. Windham did it an amazing 3 times, including twice at Washougal, making it the only venue in which Carmichael suffered multiple 1-1 defeats, both by Windham.

**CHAMPIONSHIP %:** The winner of the 450 Class at Washougal has gone on to win the championship in 16 of 31 seasons (52%), most recently in 2019. Chase Sexton will look to play spoiler once again as he chases a third consecutive victory at Washougal this season.

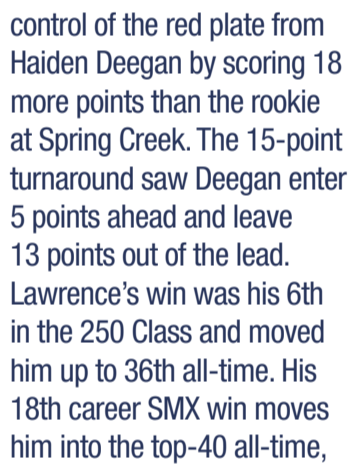

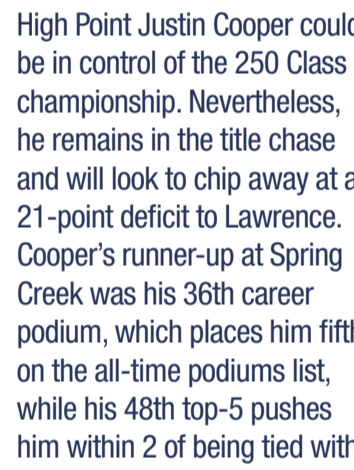

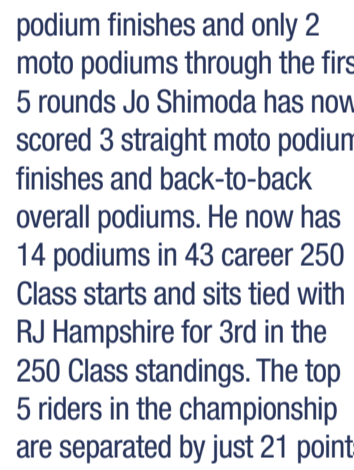
SPRING CREEK RECAP



**RED-REDEMPTION:** Joey Savatgy reclaimed control of the red plate from Haideen Deegan by scoring 18 more points than the rookie at Spring Creek. The 15-point turnaround saw Deegan enter 5 points ahead and leave 13 points out of the lead. Lawrence's win was his 6th in the 250 Class and moved him up to 36th all-time. His 18th career SMX win moves him into the top-40 all-time, tied with Trey Canard and Christophe Pourcel.



**STILL IN THE HUNT:** If not for a missed Cooper could be in control of the 250 Class championship. Nevertheless, he remains in the title chase and will look to chip away at a 21-point deficit to Lawrence. Cooper's runner-up at Spring Creek was his 36th career podium, which places him fifth on the all-time podiums list, while his 48th top-5 pushes him within 2 of being tied with Mike Brown for 5th all-time on that list.



**HITTING HIS STRIDE:** After he recorded no overall podium finishes and only 2 moto podiums through the first 5 rounds Jo Shimoda has now scored 3 straight moto podium finishes and back-to-back overall podiums. He now has 14 podiums in 43 career 250 Class starts and sits tied with RJ Hampshire for 3rd in the 250 Class standings. The top 5 riders in the championship are separated by just 21 points with 4 rounds and 8 motos remaining.



**NOTES:**  
**RJ Hampshire (4th)** His 35th top-5 finish ties him with Ricky Carmichael and Jeff Emig for 15th on the all-time 250 Class list.  
**Levi Kitchen (5th)** Made his 20th career start and scored his 6th top-5 finish.  
**Austin Forkner (9th)** Made his return to action after an injury at the opening Supercross round. He earned his 34th top-10 finish and made his 45th career 250 Class start.  
**James Cottrell (36th)** Was the only 250 Class rider to make his debut.

WASHOUGAL FACTS

**HISTORY LESSON:** The first 250 Class race held at Washougal was on July 6, 1980, when Mark Barnett went 1-2 to take the win on a Suzuki. He went on to capture his first of 3 consecutive championships that season. Chuck Sun swept the 500cc division, and also went on to win the title.

**42 SEASONS OF HISTORY:** The first 250 Class has not been a part of the 250 Class schedule just twice since that first race in 1980, in 1987 and the COVID-shortened 2020 season. That makes the 2023 event the 42nd time the 250 Class and Pro Motocross will visit Washougal. Combined with 13 total 500cc races and 31 total 450 Class races, 2023 will signify the 86th and 87th Pro Motocross races held at Washougal.

**A WIN IS A WIN:** Joey Savatgy and Aaron Plessinger took victory in the 250 Class at Washougal in 2017 and 2018, respectively, with unconventional moto scores. In 2017, Savatgy earned the overall after going 7-1 (39 points), while Plessinger followed with a winning 4-3 effort (38 points) in 2018. They remain 2 of the lowest point totals scored for an overall winner in Pro Motocross history.

**CHAMPIONSHIP %:** The winner of the 250 Class at Washougal has gone on to win the title in 20 of 41 seasons (48%), but it has happened just 3 times over the past decade. Just last season Jett Lawrence won at Washougal with 2-2 scores and went on to win the title.
